

## Chronology of former School of Arts, Montville

- 1938 Gloria lights shaded so they could be used solely for stage purposes.<sup>1</sup>  
Painting of hall by W Vining (painter). The paint to be used was 1 ½ cwt Champions white lead no.1; 7 lbs burnt Sienna pigment and 7lbs Oxford Ocre pigment.<sup>2</sup>  
Door repaired and wooden seats painted<sup>3</sup>  
Local branch of QCWA was granted permission to build a separate cupboard for private use, above the existing sewing cupboard.<sup>4</sup>  
Repairs to front fence and side fence oiled<sup>5</sup>
- 1939 Loyal Montville Lodge granted permission to place notice board outside building<sup>6</sup>  
Ceiling had dropped in one place and two boards needed relacing at back of stage<sup>7</sup>  
An iron door to match galley and stove piping installed, along with new copper.<sup>8</sup>
- 1940 Lighting installed in hall. Dance was held on 1 May 1940 to fund installation of electric light. Committee member, Mr Farrington, was asked to switch on the night at a special ceremony<sup>9</sup>  
Tender of Mr R Patterson to paint roof (red oxide) for £4 accepted<sup>10</sup>  
Agreed to build paling fence in front of building<sup>11</sup>.
- 1942 New steps made for front of stage and barge board replaced on north end of the building<sup>12</sup> Two new barge boards 21feet long, 8 inches wide and 1 inch thick purchased.<sup>13</sup>  
3 ply purchased to cover windows in event of a blackout<sup>14</sup>  
Windows to be painted black<sup>15</sup>  
Fence between the church and School of Arts to be painted and cost divided.<sup>16</sup>
- 1943 Brown paper removed from window as blackout restrictions have been lifted.<sup>17</sup>
- 1944 New barge board to be organised by Chairman<sup>18</sup>
- 1945 New tank and stand purchased and made so that a tap could be put in the supper room<sup>19</sup>
- 1949 Replacing canvas on deck chairs in hall<sup>20</sup>
- 1949 AGM agreed that School of Arts should be painted – roof and exterior and possibly interior depending on cost<sup>21</sup>
- 1952 Minutes record thanks CWA for 2 cypress pine trees<sup>22</sup>

- 1954 Ante-room door and escape door repaired<sup>23</sup>
- 1954 M Mauley built new cabinet for the “pick-up”.<sup>24</sup>  
Agreed to purchase plastic sink<sup>25</sup> Mr Leon, builder, asked to give quote on repairs and replacement of stumps under the building<sup>26</sup>
- 1955 Committee agreed to polish floor<sup>27</sup>
- 1956 *Hall was painted inside and the floor sanded and polished. New light shades etc were bought. New stumps were fitted and the usual maintenance kept up.*<sup>28</sup>
- 1957 Committee agreed to have the ante-room lined and ceiled. Mr Muirhead purchase old steps<sup>29</sup>  
Request granted to install porch light.<sup>30</sup>
- 1958 Fluorescent lights installed by Mr Fresser for £42/10/-.<sup>31</sup>
- CWA sent a letter to the School of Arts regarding a supper room. Mr Williams offered to draw up plans and specifications for a supper room. Committee accepted offer<sup>32</sup>  
Committee member (and builder) Mr Williams provided plan for a supper room, estimated cost £500. The price included full lining but did not include electrical fittings or painting and the Health Act requires only first class building timbers and materials.<sup>33</sup> The supper room was to be 51 feet by 12 feet and require no alteration to the present building. Tenders were called.<sup>34</sup>
- No tenders could be accepted because of lack of finance. Public meeting called for 14 July to discuss and appoint a committee to raise the necessary funds.<sup>35</sup>  
It was suggested the supper room could be built underneath but this was deemed *impracticable*. It was agreed that the only way to proceed was by a voluntary working bee. A committee was formed to organise labour comprising Messrs Williams, Murray, Hooper, Callaghan and Craig. Mr Williams was appointed in charge of the committee. He said the first step was to make application to the shire office for a building permit. The money which would be raised by a Talent Quest and a CWA function which were already organised. Mr Williams was to organise materials giving the School of Arts the full discount from the Montville trading Company.<sup>36</sup>
- Mr Hill requested that more power points be installed for showing pictures and that the box be moved to the front of the hall. Committee hoped to move the box when the alterations to build the super room were carried out.<sup>37</sup>
- 1959 So few came forward to assist with the working bee for the supper room, it was agreed the renovation of the hall floor in abeyance<sup>38</sup>. Cost of supper room had so depleted the funds that the Montville FGP&P Association was asked to

donate a case of pineapples for a fund raising drive to pay for the installation of 3 lights in the new room.<sup>39</sup> Mr Hill held a picture benefit night<sup>40</sup>

Pineapple drive held by Fruitgrowers Association for the new lights was very successful<sup>41</sup>

Mr Manley employed to paint exterior of new supper room at a cost of no more than £50. Quote to be obtained from Mr RB Brown for moving the projection room from the back to the front of the hall<sup>42</sup>

1960 Chairman drew special attention to the work being undertaken by the Junior Farmers and Badminton Clubs in the formation of a Powder Room<sup>43</sup> It was agreed to assist both groups by providing the piping and basin for the powder room (up to £10)<sup>44</sup>  
Agreed to install a new light on the side of the hall<sup>45</sup>

1961 Junior Farmer's Club requested that the space above the stage be ceiled to stop draughts blowing on the band. This was agreed to and also the adjustment of the front steps.<sup>46</sup>

1962 Montville Ladies' Club agreed to line the supper room<sup>47</sup>

1963 Supper room lined<sup>48</sup> It was agreed that groups could meet rent free in the building providing they raised funds for the hall, as this had been the arrangement for the Montville Ladies' Club. It was agreed to put a plaque on the wall acknowledging that the lining of the supper room was done by the Ladies' Club.<sup>49</sup>

The hall need rewiring and the exterior of the hall required painting.

1964 To ensure the survival of the hall, it was agreed that the running of the hall had to become more of a community effort instead of being left to Library Subscribers only. The subscribers agreed to finalise their control of the hall and a public meeting was called to form a committee to run the hall.<sup>50</sup>

Committee of seven formed to operate the hall. Mrs Mathers; Mr RG McCullough; Mr Murray; Mr Roland Thorne Seccombe Brown; Mr White; Mrs White and Mrs Baker formed the committee. As the library had been such a financial loss, the new committee agreed to discontinue the library. As the caretaker's duties were very limited, the position was discontinued. All outstanding bills were to be settled.<sup>51</sup>

Ladies' Club requested permission to plant trees or shrubs where the School of Arts fence had been removed. Permission was granted for 2 trees to be planted on the church side of the hall to balance the two pine trees growing on the opposite side.<sup>52</sup>

Roof to be painted by Mr K Manby and voluntary assistance at a cost of £25<sup>53</sup>  
Trees to be planted where fence had been removed<sup>54</sup>

“A discussion took place regarding work on the hall. It was suggested that something be done to modernise the front of the hall by replacing the present shabby porch with a new structure”. Mr McCullough to investigate cost with Don McCulloch.<sup>55</sup>

1965

Still waiting to paint roof. The materials for a new porch – concrete and brick walls and iron roof) would cost approximately £25 for a structure 15’ by 6’. It “had been suggested that a porch should be built, large enough for cars to drive under in wet weather, to allow people to step directly under shelter at the door of the hall”. This would cost around £100 and it was felt that painting the exterior was more urgent. It was agreed to paint the walls by voluntary labour as soon as the roof painted.<sup>56</sup>

Mr Manley was unable to procure voluntary labour to paint the roof and they would have to employ someone.<sup>57</sup> Mr N Hosking of Nambour completed the roof painting at a cost of £22/10/-. A further £30/8/- was spent on brushes and paint, thanks to a generous discount from Mr White.<sup>58</sup> It was agreed that Mr Manby would be in charge of the voluntary labour required to paint the church exterior and the ladies could choose the colour.<sup>59</sup>

The Parents and Citizens Committee of the School requested that the steps on the outside of the powder room be repaired before the Deb Ball in July. On investigation it was found they had collapsed.<sup>60</sup>

16 lengths of guttering had been purchase for the hall and Mr Mathers had done the necessary soldering. This was to be erected on the western side of the hall. 45 feet of downpiping was also needed.<sup>61</sup>

The chosen colours were to be grey green for the external walls and guttering of Wild Olive. Other trims were to be antique white.<sup>62</sup>

Stage painted during year.<sup>63</sup>

4 December working bee held to replace and repair weather boards and timber where necessary and to erect new guttering and downpipes. Extra guttering was to be ordered for the porch.<sup>64</sup> Six men attended and the guttering was replaced on the western side; boards were replaced and some pine was replaced on two doors.<sup>65</sup>

Repairs were needed for the floor boards as large holes were becoming dangerous. Repaired with plastic wood by Mr Love.<sup>66</sup>

1966

The steps at the rear of the hall, leading from the old projection room, were removed as they were considered dangerous.<sup>67</sup> As the cost of replacing a pair of doors on the church side was prohibitive, the old doors were repaired.<sup>68</sup>

Mr Mathers requested that the fence between the church and hall be altered to make mowing easier.<sup>69</sup> After discussions with the church it was agreed to take down the fence, leaving only the corner posts to mark the dividing line.<sup>70</sup> Montville QCWA donated \$300 which the committee agreed to use for a new porch. It was agreed to approach a builder about ideas and cost.<sup>71</sup> The eastern side of the hall was painted which left only the back wall to be done. As this wall was high and awkward it was agreed to employ a tradesman for that section. Coats were to be called for in *The Nambour Chronicle* for 3 coats of paint.<sup>72</sup>

- 1967 Quotes to obtained from Mr Leon for new floor and porch.<sup>73</sup> Committee agreed to postpone painting the back wall. The quotes for the porch were \$330 and the floor \$700. The Montville Ladies and Social Benefit Club had offered to donate \$300 towards the floor, It was greed that if the CWA agreed the balance of their donation could be used for the floor.<sup>74</sup> The CWA agreed and tenders were called for reflooring an area of 50' by 21' with first grade timber.<sup>75</sup> Five tenders were received.<sup>76</sup> Mr H Ritchings of Maleny was awarded the contract, which cost \$483 plus \$7.90 for restumping. R Glanville sanded the floor at a cost of \$60.<sup>77</sup> Mr McCullough voluntarily repainted the area below the stage<sup>78</sup> Mr Everitt of Woombye was employed to paint the back wall.<sup>79</sup> Council agreed that water from the tank on the green could be piped to the hall. The old tank stand was removed.<sup>80</sup>
- 1968 Mr K Coates was employed to install piping, fittings and power for the water supply.<sup>81</sup> Ladies Social and Benefit Club donated roller blind on the western wall of the hall to make it cooler.<sup>82</sup>
- Committee agreed to employ plumber, Mr Allen Waters, to repair leaks in roof of supper room. Agreed also to remove the very shabby windows between the supper room and main hall. Mr McCullough and Mr Moll to do work.<sup>83</sup>
- 1969 By March the supper room roof had been repaired and the windows removed. Mr D Shanks was employed to neaten up the empty spaces where the windows had been removed before painting.<sup>84</sup> Mr Shanks filled in the supper room side with masonite and finishing the edges on the hall side by forming alcoves or window boxes.<sup>85</sup>
- 1970 Ladies and Social Benefit Club paid for the top of the servery cupboard to be covered with laminex by Mr D Shanks.<sup>86</sup> New stage curtains were made by the Committee Ladies and a new curtain track installed.<sup>87</sup>

Painting of supper room commenced by voluntary labour by Mr Mill, Mr McCullough and Mr Murray in February. Quote to be obtained from Mr Shanks for repairing a hole in the caneite ceiling of the powder room caused by a possum and to repair the floor in the upper room so that it could be covered by lino in the future.<sup>88</sup> Kitchen, powder room and stage also painted by volunteers. Mr Shanks covered the supper room floor with masonite.<sup>89</sup> The Secretary painted the floor.<sup>90</sup>

1971 Committee erected new tank on hall for kitchen supply as water from Council tank was brown and unsuitable for drinking<sup>91</sup>

1972 Permission granted to CWA to build 8' cupboard as close as possible to the kitchen end of the supper room<sup>92</sup>

1973 An inspection of the building was carried out in February and it was found that the exterior walls needed painting; the eastern side steps needed repair as did the western side and the roof required nailing down.<sup>93</sup> Mr McCullough repainted the front of the stage.<sup>94</sup>

The October meeting found that all steps needed repair; painting of roof and walls required; guttering and downpipes needed attention and the roof was leaking in the projection room.<sup>95</sup> The walls were washed, the floor dressed, stairs repaired and grounds slashed at a working bee on 20 October.<sup>96</sup>

1974 K Manley painted the hall exterior, with voluntary assistance and the interior was painted by volunteers. Half the roof was lifted from the supper room and a sheet was added to prevent rain coming in. Some guttering was replaced. The side steps were repaired and strengthened. Concrete steps were built at the front and outside door on church side. Some more supports were put under the room behind the stage.<sup>97</sup> 9 November dinner held to celebrate 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the hall.<sup>98</sup>

1975 Powder room painted and masonite flooring built<sup>99</sup> Fruitgrowers and Progress Association disbanded.<sup>100</sup> Committee became the Montville Hall Committee and Progress Association<sup>101</sup> The role of the committee changed. It promoted activities with the dual aim of caring for the local hall and for providing a venue for discussions on the progress of the district. Funds raised were to be used for the upkeep and improvements to the hall. The organisation also provided an avenue for the community to approach the Shire Council, members of Parliament and Government Departments concerning the area.<sup>102</sup>

1976 Kitchen extended. D McCulloch and Arthur Walker paid to do main frame with voluntary labour by Mr T Barnett, Mr K Manley and Mr L Harper<sup>103</sup> D McCulloch donated kitchen tiles and A & B Tutin donated laminex for benches.<sup>104</sup>

- 1976 Trees and shrubs removed and replaced at front of hall.<sup>105</sup>
- 1977 Motion put that the Hall committee take over responsibility of the RSL Hall.<sup>106</sup>
- 1978 Repairs and painting of roof and replacement of guttering carried out by committee members. New timber was placed around the inside of the main entrance door<sup>107</sup>
- 1979 Hall roof painted and guttering and gateway entrance<sup>108</sup>  
Mr Alan Sly to repaint honour boards<sup>109</sup>
- 1980 Mr Alan Sly reported that hall needed restumping<sup>110</sup>  
Tank and stand replaced. Committee applied for \$ for \$ subsidy to provide a tank that could be used by the public for drinking water. Council agreed to provide subsidy for tank for hall use.<sup>111</sup>
- 1981 Sheet metal notice board put on outside of porch<sup>112</sup>
- Committee received \$600 grant from Maroochy Shire Council for tank and tankstand at the hall<sup>113</sup> A 1000 gallon water tank and stand were erected at the rear of the hall to provide rainwater for the kitchen.
- 1982 Hall used for CWA 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary luncheon; Methodist Church 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations; Masonic Temple opening celebration dinner; Ladies Annual Flower Show and Luncheon; school orchestra concert; weddings; and many small functions.<sup>114</sup>
- 1983 Hall celebrated 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary and the proposed plans included complete renovation of the stage – curtains, lighting, amplification, dressing rooms. This did not happen.
- Following vandals lighting fire under hall, wire mesh was installed around underside of hall. Work completed by D McCulloch and P Brodie. G Carpenter and Ruberry painted it as it was not galvanised.<sup>115</sup>
- Roofing iron on hall and supper room repaired<sup>116</sup>
- On the initiative of the Montville Ladies' Club five ceiling fans and standing fans were donated and installed.<sup>117</sup>
- 1984 Commonwealth Employment Programme undertook repairs to Hall and St Mary's Hall. The buildings were painted under this scheme.
- Alan Sly secured donations from the RSL for the Honour Board and renovation of the memorial gates.

Parallel parking was established on the access drive to the hall<sup>118</sup>

- 1985 Committee introduced a disco and a live rock band to the hall to increase attendance. Not particularly successful.  
The kitchen and supper room cupboards were replaced. Work carried out by Des and Bev McCulloch, much of the time and materials being donated by them.  
New blinds for hall windows. Stage curtains have been ordered, donated by ladies Club.
- 1986 A wheelchair accessible pedestal installed in Ladies public toilet.<sup>119</sup>  
New steps to supper room and the new hand rails were constructed and position by Mr C Hooper at no cost to the committee<sup>120</sup> The ramp was repaired by D & B McCulloch at no cost to the committee.<sup>121</sup>  
Hot water system installed and downpipe and rear of hall repaired.<sup>122</sup>
- 1987 The area between the memorial gates and hall was paved.<sup>123</sup>  
Hall roof damaged by hail on 23 October
- 1988 Roof repainted with insurance claim of \$946. Saving for a complete new roof and replacing supper room ceiling.<sup>124</sup>  
December - Montville Hall and Progress Association renamed Montville Village Association Inc.
- 1989 Reported that western walls required painting for sun protection and hall needed internal painting. Aging supper room roof repaired for leaks. The Christmas and Easter murals were renovated.<sup>125</sup>  
Montville branch of CWA closed. Plaque to commemorate the CWA erected in hall.<sup>126</sup>  
An electrical sub-main was installed for the hall kitchen. A new stove was provided by the Ladies Club. The hall walls were professionally cleaned inside and out.  
  
The lane outside the hall was officially named Memorial Close<sup>127</sup>
- 1991 The Hall was reroofed and roof supports were strengthened. Jack Warren provided engineering opinions and drawings. Eric Porter and Bob Allen oversaw the project. Mel Rogers did the electrical wiring and Bev McCulloch cleaned the roof interior. The hall's exterior was last painted in 1984 and required external and internal painting.<sup>128</sup> The exterior was painted by Des McCulloch and Evan Williams. \$16,000 was spent on painting.<sup>129</sup>
- 1992 Concerns raised about the structure of the hall prompted the engagement of Parnell and Associates, Structural Engineers of Maleny to assess the building. They reported the building was sound considering its age but need some work

to be carried out with the stumps and the floor joists as well as improving ventilation under the hall to improve the passage of air. The work was completed. Parnell commented "It is an attractive building in a superb location and fulfilling a very useful function within the Community and as such, any modifications or alterations should be carried out with sensitivity."<sup>130</sup>

The Ladies Club requested toilets with internal access from the hall. Eric Porter devised plans.<sup>131</sup>

Hall lasted painted inside in 1974. Rail needed as buffer against the chairs.<sup>132</sup> Evan Williams was contracted to paint hall.

1993 8 February a special meeting was held to discuss the future of the hall. 30 people present. Phillip Harrison (architect) *spoke of the hall's exterior and the its intimate quality inside*. Mark Penman (singer) *spoke of the hall's fine acoustics and the intimate quality of the hall from a performer's point of view*. Bev McCulloch spoke of extending the building to *increase its potential use*. It was agreed that no extensions should be made to the west and a sub-committee would be formed to investigate hall improvements.<sup>133</sup> Plans, prepared by architect Phillip Harrison, were presented to a meeting on 27 September 1993.

1994 Two plans were presented to the committee for upgrading the hall. The Ladies Club supported Plan A. Phillip Harrison opposed Plan B's shortening of the stage. Bev McCulloch spoke in favour on Plan B which provided a larger kitchen and storage on floor level. A vote in favour of Plan B was taken and plans were to be drawn up for Council.<sup>134</sup> The plan extended the rear of the rear of the hall, consisting of change rooms and men's and ladies toilets. The second stage included extending the kitchen and powder room to create a larger kitchen and disabled toilet.<sup>135</sup>

The matter clearly caused controversy as the vote was rescinded at the next meeting. A motion was carried that old Hall Maintenance Committee become the Montville Hall Committee and that it would report monthly to the Montville Village Association. The members were Les Gittens, Phillip Harrison, Bev McCulloch, Mark Penman, Bryan McLennan, John Taylor and a representative from the Ladies Club. All plans should be taken back to the Montville Hall Committee for re-drafting. Consideration should be given to storing the new piano and improved staging of plays. There was \$20,250.33 in the building fund.<sup>136</sup> Revised Pan A was prepared by Phillip Harrison with provision for a Historical Society Room and was adopted for costing and Council approval.<sup>137</sup>

White post erected in ground on east side of hall entrance mid-way between hall and memorial gates to stop people driving on pavers. Provided by Cr Schwabe.<sup>138</sup>

George Carpenter's Mural in Hall of World War II, was at times causing offence as it was a graphic rendition of war. George agreed to remove mural. This left a bare area where the mural had been.<sup>139</sup> A special fitting was installed to allow a mural to be hung on the side of the hall at Christmas.<sup>140</sup>

1997 Lt Colonel George Carpenter died 27 January 1997. A stalwart of Montville community, he was President of the Hall and Progress Association from 1982 until 1984. George Carpenter Place named in his honour on 30 March

The Montville Hall Extension and Maintenance Committee was resurrected comprising Judy Phippen, Ian Russell, Les Gittens, Bev McCulloch and Margaret Farmer (ladies' Club rep) as member. An acceptable plan was in hand for toilets, change rooms, storeroom etc.<sup>141</sup>

In July it was agreed that the full extension shell would be built to lock up stage; the toilets and shower would be installed using funds raised by Ladies Club; the rear stage wall would be rebuilt with double doors with money provided by grant from Maroochy Shire Council and alterations to the kitchen, servery, change rooms and storage areas would be built as funds allowed. Tenders could not be called under this system so Ross Sinclair was employed on a cost-plus basis and Phillip Harrison agreed to work with him. The plans were sent to Council for approval. The building fund held \$31,428.42.<sup>142</sup> The Ladies Club had donated approximately \$8000 towards the toilets for the extensions.<sup>143</sup>

The extension provided one male, one female and one disabled toilet; a shower with small change area and two change rooms to the rear of the stage. The rear wall of the stage was replaced with similar material. A much larger kitchen was provided with a rearranged servery with improved door systems. The electrical system was upgraded to provide three phase power which would provide better lighting for stage productions. A new store room was built.<sup>144</sup>

1998 By May the extensions were at lock-up stage. The ramp was completed and the tank was back under the building. The internal framework and flooring was finished as far as possible.<sup>145</sup> A private investor agreed to lend \$10,000 to finish the project.<sup>146</sup> The Montville Village Association successfully applied for a Gaming Benefit Fund grant for \$15,000 for the kitchen refurbishment. A further \$20,000 was needed for completion.<sup>147</sup> A new landing and ramp was built at the eastern door and new landing and steps outside the toilet area.

2000 Some modifications were required by the Theatre Company which they agreed to fund as money became available. The list included the relocation of the unused vanity and wash basin in the small toilet; reconnecting the existing plumbing to the dressing room; removal of the unconnected pedestal and convert room to storage area; remove the wall after vanity removed; put in double hinged partition opening to dressing room; reposition lighting bar to

provide space for installation of a “traveller” curtain; paint the stage walls in a flat non-reflective paint and double hinge the double doors.<sup>148</sup>

- 2002 David Polley to do repairs. Awnings added to hall
- 2003 Applied for grant for repairs and maintenance to hall. Side door awnings to protect the entries, fixed paving and drainage and a fresh paint job inside and out were identified as priorities.<sup>149</sup>
- 2004 Repairs and maintenance required at hall. Council to assist with landscaping works at the front of the hall to stop further damage caused by storm water run-off from the road.<sup>150</sup>
- 2005 Right hand barge board above main entry of Montville Hall repaired. Drain built along southern side of Montville Hall and porch leading to escarpment. Colour bond metal awnings placed over eastern and western double doors and over bathroom/toilet door in December. Manufactured by Stratco, installed by David Polley and repainted by Richard Wolski. Carpet replaced in backstage area in hall.
- 2006 Montville hall floor sanded and polished by Caloundra Floor Sanding. Interior and exterior of Montville hall painted by Richard Wolski in June (lunchroom and back stage areas not included, ramp and railings were included). Tongue and Groove boards replaced and door architraves replaced at stage side doors by Hamish Borthwick. Eastern ramp repaired by David Polley. Handrailings on both east and west stairs to stage installed by Blackall Range Woodcrafters.
- Gardens around memorial gates completely renovated in February with roses. Garden bed established along south eastern road frontage and along eastern side of hall to define and protect the hall precinct. Paving at the hall entrance was extended to provide access to ramp and east door of front porch.
